

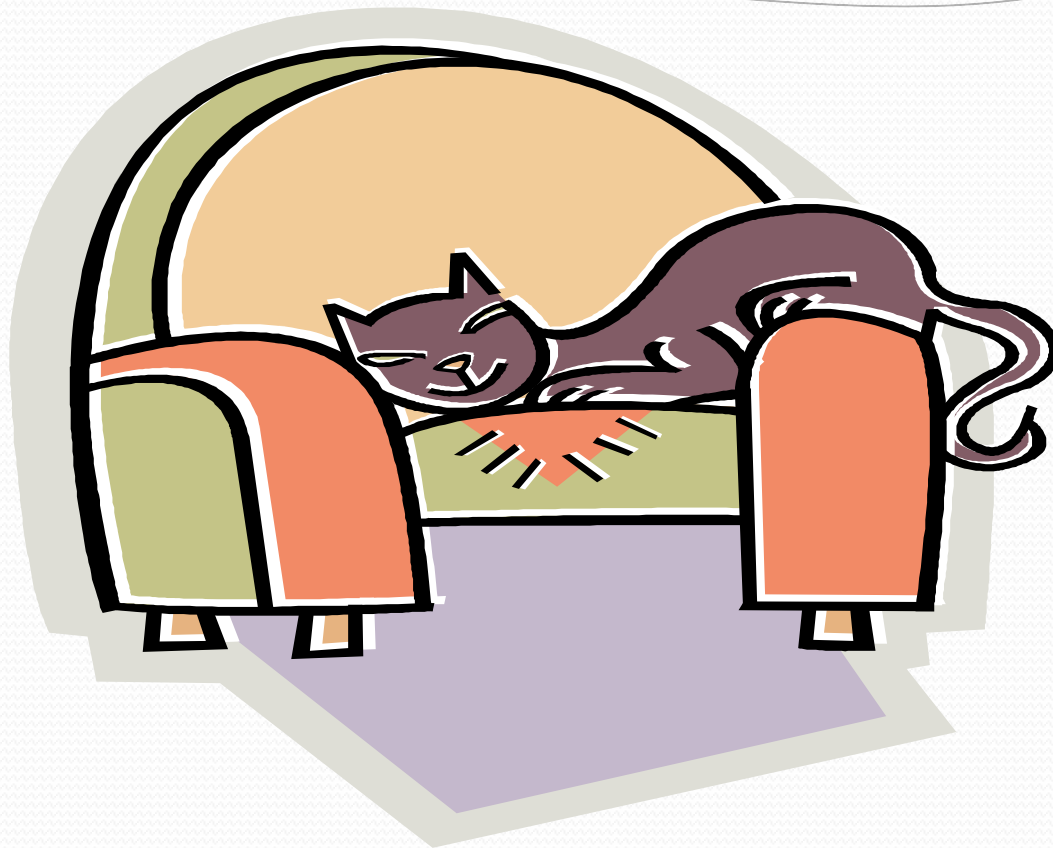
Tessie and the kittens



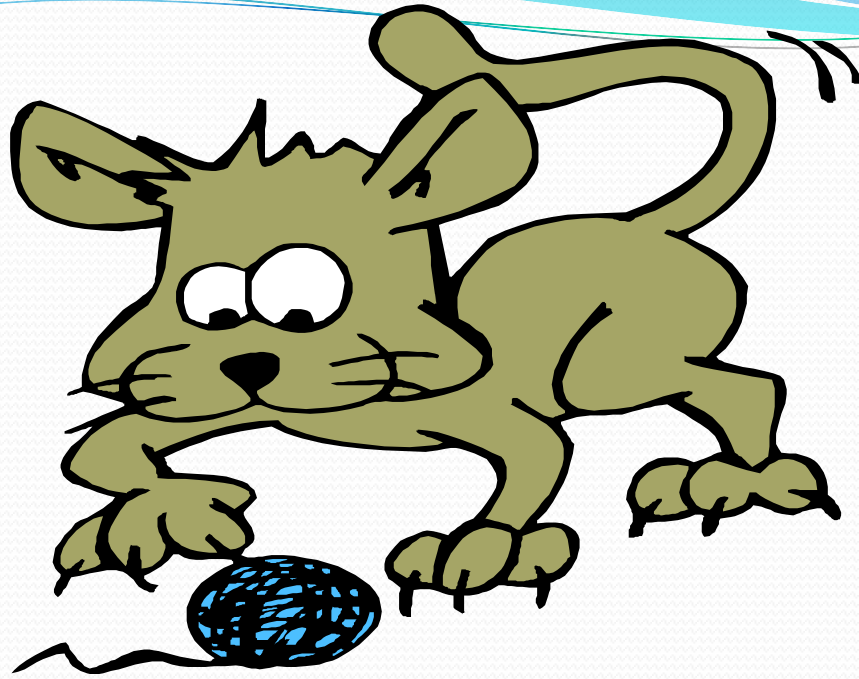
Tessie has nine kittens. Sometimes

are and what they are doing.

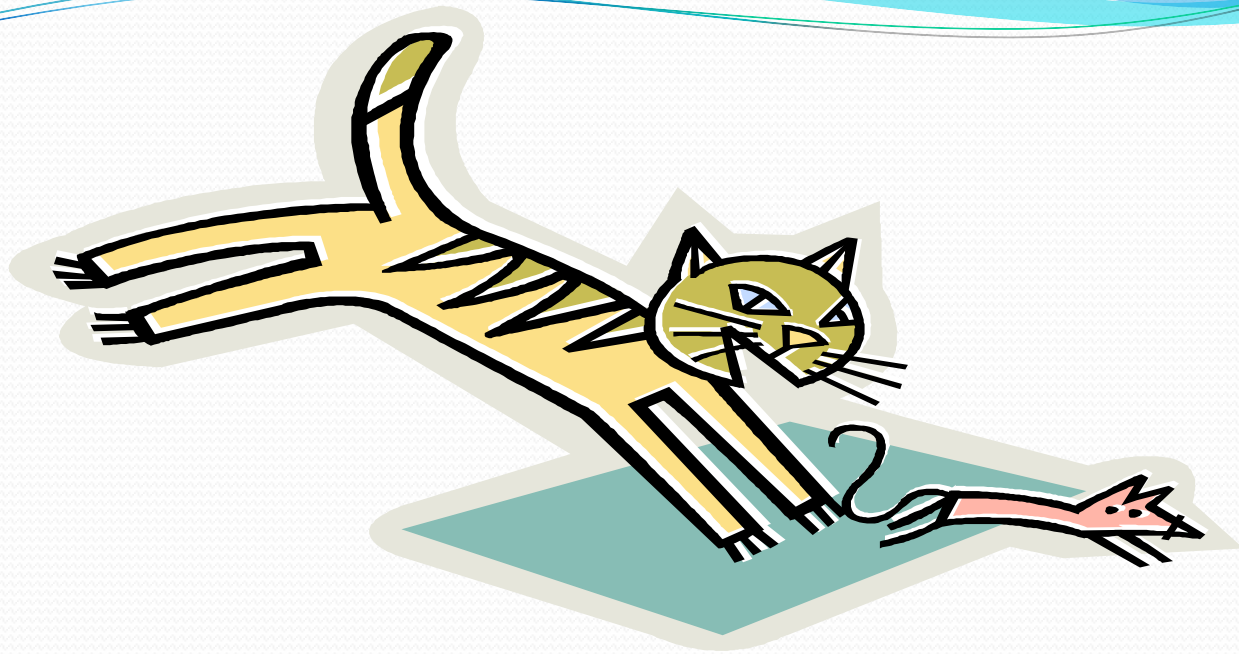

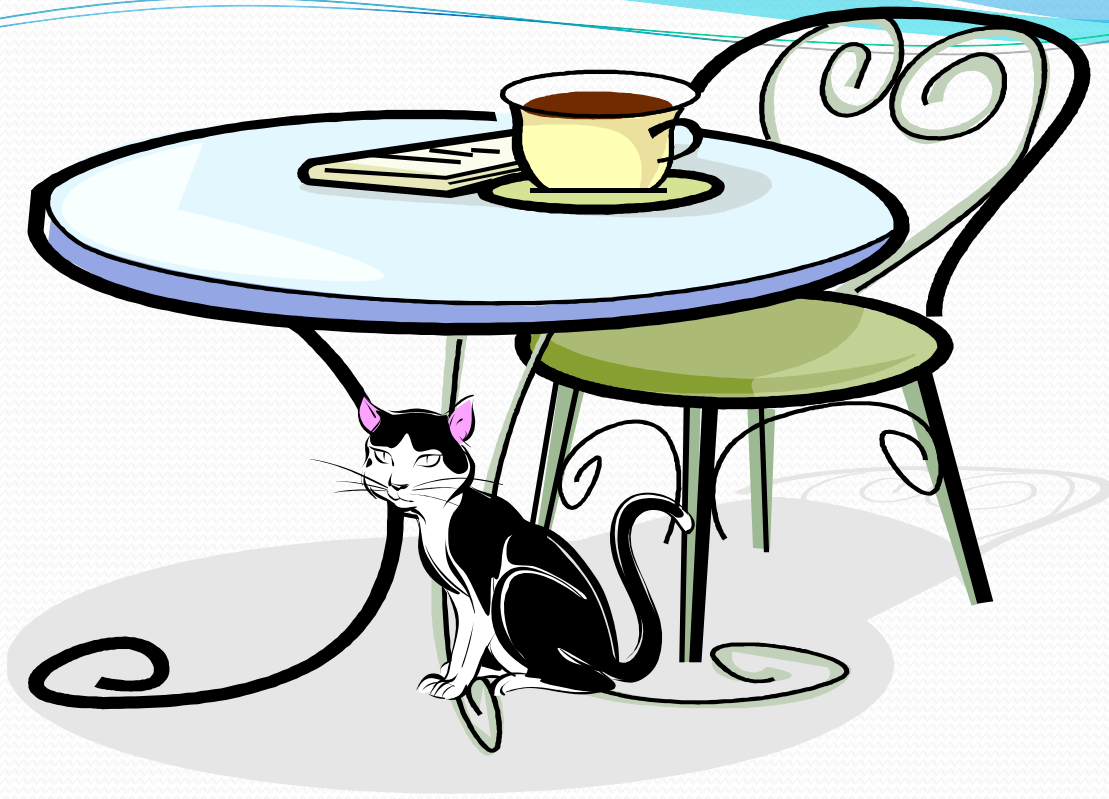
1. Trixy is asleep on the sofa.
